PANDEMIC-RELATED PROJECTS

- Volunteers in Lancaster, PA, Harrisonburg, VA, Berlin, OH, and other locations made more than 260,000 masks.
- Kansas volunteers helped Hesston College and Tabor College make changes to their facilities in order to safely accommodate students.
- The Spirit of MDS Fund distributed \$48,000 to 46 congregations in Canada who responded to needs in their communities.
- MDS joined with Mennonite Central Committee and Everence to create a COVID-19 Congregational Relief Fund, which provided grants to 174 congregations to support their needs as a result of COVID-19.
