This application is for anyone desiring to serve four weeks or more with MDS, including leadership volunteers, RV volunteers, and those serving without a leadership assignment.

Mennonite Disaster Service Vision and Mission

We strive to be the hands and feet of Jesus to those affected by disasters.

We respond to disasters, rebuild homes, and restore hope by organizing and empowering volunteers in the U.S. and Canada.

Volunteer assignments with Mennonite Disaster Service (MDS)

MDS volunteers serve as a way of modeling their lives after Jesus, who showed us the way of peace and served those around him who were in need. Leadership, Long-Term and RV volunteers are Christians who are active participants in a church and are in agreement with the shared convictions of MDS stated at the end of this application.

Traditional Projects: The majority of volunteers spend an average of one week serving with MDS on a volunteer crew. Weekly volunteers rely on leadership volunteers who serve four weeks or more, coordinating the work and connecting them with clients. As an MDS long-term volunteer, you may become involved with a variety of tasks including clean up, carpentry, administrative and office duties, volunteer hosting, food preparation and leadership. You will become part of a volunteer team serving together to help get people back home after a disaster.

RV Projects: The RV Program is designed for volunteers age 55+ who stay in their own RVs and serve four days weekly, six hours daily for a minimum of four weeks. For married couples, both husband and wife are encouraged to serve but one spouse may elect not to serve for personal or health reasons. RV volunteers prepare their own meals and need to have kitchen, toilet and shower facilities in their RV.

MDS volunteers build more than houses

MDS volunteers are known for repairing and rebuilding homes damaged by disasters, but the impact of MDS is more than just construction. MDS provides an opportunity for you to walk alongside disaster survivors, bringing the dignity and respect of God's love to their recovery. Both homeowners and volunteers often find that their lives are changed, and their faith is strengthened through this experience of serving together. Volunteers become the hands and feet of Jesus.

Information for you to know...

- Completing a long-term application form and participating in an interview does not guarantee placement on an MDS project site.
- Travel expenses will be reimbursed in accordance with the current MDS policy and a small stipend will be provided.
- Volunteers are responsible for their own medical insurance. MDS is not responsible for medical coverage related to accidents or personal injury.
- Long-term volunteers must be at least 18 years old.
- MDS does not allow pets on projects. If an RV site allows pets, RV volunteers may bring pets that can be left alone in the RV.

Long-term MDS volunteers agree to:

- Nurture your relationship with God while on assignment through participation in daily group devotionals and church attendance.
- Serve at least 40-45 hours/week (RV volunteers serve 4 days per week, 6 hours per day).
- Use safety equipment on job sites.
- Refrain from the use of alcohol, tobacco, cannabis and illegal substances while serving with MDS.
- Respect people from different ethnic and cultural backgrounds, both in the communities where MDS serves and among the diverse MDS constituents.
- Respect the authority of the MDS Project Director. Inform the Project Director of plans to take trips during scheduled time off.
- Abide by the MDS dress code while on MDS projects. Dress code can be found in the Volunteer Guide.
- Embrace MDS Core Values: Faith in Action, Caring Relationships, & Working Together.

Shared Convictions

By the grace of God, we seek to live and proclaim the good news of reconciliation in Jesus Christ. As part of the one body of Christ at all times and places, we hold the following to be central to our belief and practice:

- 1. God is known to us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the Creator who seeks to restore fallen humanity by calling a people to be faithful in fellowship, worship, service and witness.
- 2. Jesus is the Son of God. Through his life and teachings, his cross and resurrection, he showed us how to be faithful disciples, redeemed the world, and offers eternal life.

- 4. As a faith community, we accept the Bible as our authority for faith and life, interpreting it together under Holy Spirit guidance, in the light of Jesus Christ to discern God's will for our obedience.
- 5. The Spirit of Jesus empowers us to trust God in all areas of life, so we become peacemakers who renounce violence, love our enemies, seek justice, and share our possessions with those in need.
- 6. We gather regularly to worship, to celebrate the Lord's Supper, and to hear the Word of God in a spirit of mutual accountability.
- 7. As a world-wide community of faith and life we transcend boundaries of nationality, race, class, gender and language. We seek to live in the world without conforming to the powers of evil, witnessing to God's grace by serving others, caring for creation, and inviting all people to know Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

In these convictions we draw inspiration from Anabaptist forebears of the 16th century, who modeled radical discipleship to Jesus Christ. We seek to walk in His name by the power of the Holy Spirit, as we confidently await Christ's return and the final fulfillment of God's kingdom.
